(B) Crocodiles have never had a 31 fame, but they may just have notoriously become even scarier and heavier. Recently, veterinary scientists have discovered that a surprising number of them are capable of galloping when reaching their top speeds. 32 the different gaits and sizes, almost all the species studied had a top speed of about 18km per hour. Some 33 crocodiles were less likely to gallop, but other smaller species, were more likely to gallop into the water to 34 rather than to chase prey. In fact, in evolution in different species, galloping is an energetically 35 way to get around. The horse-like gait is shared across many species. Some toads and spiders gallop, too.

Jane Goodall (珍古德) was born in England in 1934. In early childhood, Goodall became very interested in animal behavior. When she grew up, she went to Africa and studied chimpanzees. Many people thought it was a hard work, and she wouldn't go through with it. But they were wrong. She has spent more than 40 years in Africa and known as world's foremost expert on chimpanzee.

Goodall is best known for her study of chimpanzee social and family life. Goodall not only studied the chimpanzees, but also made friends with them. In 1960, Goodall went to Africa and set up a camp close to a group of chimpanzees. There Goodall fed the chimpanzees, imitated their behavior, ate with them and spent time in trees. Meanwhile, she was learning a lot about chimpanzees. She observed that they have their own basic language, can make tools and have close family bonds. People used to think that chimpanzees were vegetarian, but Goodall discovered that they are omnivores hunting for meat and killing other animals. In 1977, Goodall established the Jane Goodall Institute (國際珍古德協會). It preserves chimpanzees and helps people learn more about them. Her love for animals really makes a predominant contribution to the world.
